## President's Report

Wow what an incredible season it has been. On the back of the COVID Pandemic, the Club has experienced strong growth across all areas:

- **Increase in numbers participating in Nippers.**

With around 500 Nippers and their parents on the beach every Sunday morning.

- **Strong participation in competitions from our Little Nippers through to our Youth Age Groups.**

While our numbers competing may be still classified as small compared to other Clubs, our little champions brought home their fair share of medals, set personal bests and represented the Club in a professional manner.

- **Introduction of the Starfish Nippers Program.**

To see participation in this program was incredible, thank you to Simone Blom and everyone that was involved in this great initiative.



- **Patrolling numbers were strong throughout the season.**

We continued to provide an extended coverage of Port Coogee and increase our lifesaving infrastructure with the implementation of the North Tower located next to the Coogee Jetty.

Provided services for events run by third parties to ensure these events were run without incident.

And our Training Team provided an additional 65 (Bronzies and SRC's) resources this season to boost our patrolling numbers.

- **Our membership base was steady.**

On par with the previous season with a general increase in active Club memberships. Renamed members of the Sunset Crew from a social to a supporter member and created a Sunset Crew Supporter Club Grant that will provide funding for "Equipment Grants" annually for the following areas within the Club:

- Club Development
- Lifesaving
- Member Development (Training and Youth)
- Surf Sports & Nippers

Available funds will be based on the previous financial membership and the amount of funding available will be communicated to the respected areas within the Club on the 1st September annually. I'm pleased to announce (a little bit earlier) that \$6900 will be available for the 2021/22 season

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# Finance Report

The overall financial performance for Coogee Beach Surf Life Saving Club for 2020-2021 has been adversely affected by the restrictions imposed by the Federal and State Governments due to the COVID-19 pandemic.

These restrictions reduced revenue by an estimated \$200k (refer Table 1.0). The areas that have been affected include:-

- reduced the available operating hours of the Club's facilities and functions
- limited the number of customers able to attend functions and social nights in given time sessions
- affected our operating efficiencies by the additional required health standards and limiting economies of scale due to restricting customer numbers.

On the positive side, the Club has-:

- increased membership across most membership categories (refer Table 2.0)
- tightly managed expenses from Beach operations to function areas and received financial funding from the Federal Government through the JobKeeper and CashFlow Boost Programs.

The net profit from operations for the year was a loss of \$80,416 from revenue of \$920,698 as compared to last year's loss of \$101,920 from revenue of \$1,081,448. Adding back the benefits from JobKeeper and Cashflow Boost, this year's result improved to provide a profit of \$30,202 as compared to last year's loss of a \$83,368.

Cash from operations increased \$100,491 to \$293,424 which is an excellent result considering the constraints to which the Club has experienced during the year.

Total Members' Funds (Net Assets) increased from \$417,576 to \$447,778.



## REVENUE

Revenue for the year of \$1,034,578 was 9.4% lower than FY2020 total of \$1,100,000.

The income from the various functional areas is summarised in Table 1.0 below.

## MEMBERSHIP

Overall membership numbers increased 22.4% from 1324 last year to 1621 this year. There were positive increases across nearly all categories as summarised in Table 2.0 below.

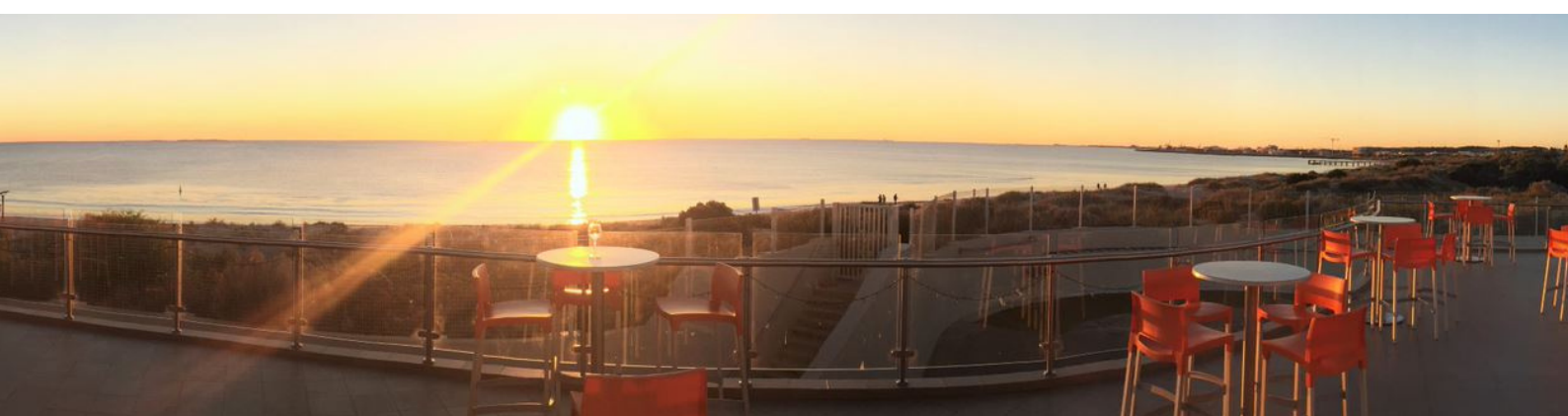
The key positives for the Club included:

- 26.5% increase in the junior numbers which is a good outcome for the Club's future development
- 62.3% increase in general membership

With the increased numbers there was 23.8% growth in membership income to \$179.1k which is an excellent outcome taking into account the effects associated with Covid-19.

## **MERCHANDISE**

Income from merchandise was similar to last year. This is not expected to increase while Woodside maintain their sponsorship arrangement with WA Surf life Saving as nippers' uniforms are supplied free of charge as a part of this sponsorship.

## **SPONSORSHIP/FUNDRAISING/GRANTS**

The main income for sponsorship was received from the Woodside arrangement.

The Club is focussing on improving the level of sponsorship and achieve similar results to prior years such as FY2019. An increase of \$6.5k was achieved this year which is a positive start to achieve our medium-term target.

A good outcome was obtained from the "Cowpat Lotto" fundraiser run by Beach Operations in March where \$14.5k was raised. These funds were directed towards the purchase of a second-hand surfboat.

## **GRANTS**

A lower level of capital improvements was targeted this year which corresponds to the reduced grant income.

## **LEASE/RENTAL INCOME**

Rent charges for the Cafe' and Gym increased this financial year in line with the rental agreements however the income was basically in line with last year as both tenants received a 50% reduction in rent charges for the first 6 months of the year to help assist them during the periods affected by the Covid-19 restrictions.

## CLUB FUNCTIONS

The restrictions imposed by the Government reduced the available number of days that the Club was available to hold functions. This is evident in Table 3.0 below where Club social and wedding functions were mainly affected.

The Club focused on increasing the number of external functions and even though we were adversely affected by the Government restrictions we were able to achieve an increase in these targeted areas.

The effect on revenue by the operating limitations has been estimated at approximately \$200k as summarised in Table 4.0 below.

## SURFSPORTS/MEMBER DEVELOPMENT

Income of \$39.1k from Surf Sports and Member Development was slightly down on than last year (\$42.7k) even though overall membership numbers for the year were significantly higher. We believed some of the decline can be attributed to effects of Covid-19 outcomes on members available income

## GROSS MARGIN/PROFIT

A summary of gross profit for the respective functional areas is summarised in Table 5.0

Gross profit from membership improved in line with the increased numbers.

Merchandise margins reduced due to redundant clothing lines which were written-off.

Club Functions margins were affected by Covid-19 where-:

- The 6 week lockdown at the beginning of the financial year required that a number of beverage and food items which were not suitable for re-sale were written-off
- After the stipulated lockdown period strict health requirements were imposed which required the Club to increase labour during functions
- Economies of scale were reduced as the number of customers were limited per function and on social nights 2 seatings were required.

## OVERHEAD EXPENSES

Overall expenses of \$418.9k, which included an annual leave provision of \$11.3k, were well controlled and less than last year's cost of \$466,576.

## NET PROFIT

Overall net profit is summarised in Table 6.0 below for the two main areas of Club operations.

## LIFESAVING

Patrick Rivers and Elise Stallard led continued lifesaving services across Coogee Beach, Port Coogee and doing water Safety Services for various community events. The year continued to provide us with the stark reminder of the vigilance required for water safety and continued education of the public who have little to no swimming capability. Unfortunately, a young man passed away after drowning at our beach after hours, with members attending after an emergency notification.

Our Lifesaving members completed 7625.67 hours for the season with beach attendances up to 194,826. The team undertook 7 rescues and treated 230 first aid injuries. The season saw Nick Gleeson awarded with SLSWA's Coastal Bravery Bronze Medallion for Courage Youth Award, with his efforts in providing first aid to an injured individual in a motor vehicle accident.



The big thing (literally) to happen in lifesaving this season was the installation of the Lotterywest beach observation tower. Strategically located between Coogee Jetty and the Eco-Shark Barrier, it provides excellent visibility over this very busy part of the beach, shelter for our patrol members and some privacy for treating patients. It has become an instant hit with our patrolling members!

Our core patrolling operations returned to relative normality, other than the brief lockdown in February that coincided fortuitously with some rainy weather. Outside of our standard patrol hours, we responded to several incidents, ranging from spinal injuries, asthma attacks and stranded kite-surfers. Our water safety services included long-time favourites like the Jetty to Jetty and new events (to us) such as School Sport WA's triathlon championships at Champion Lakes.

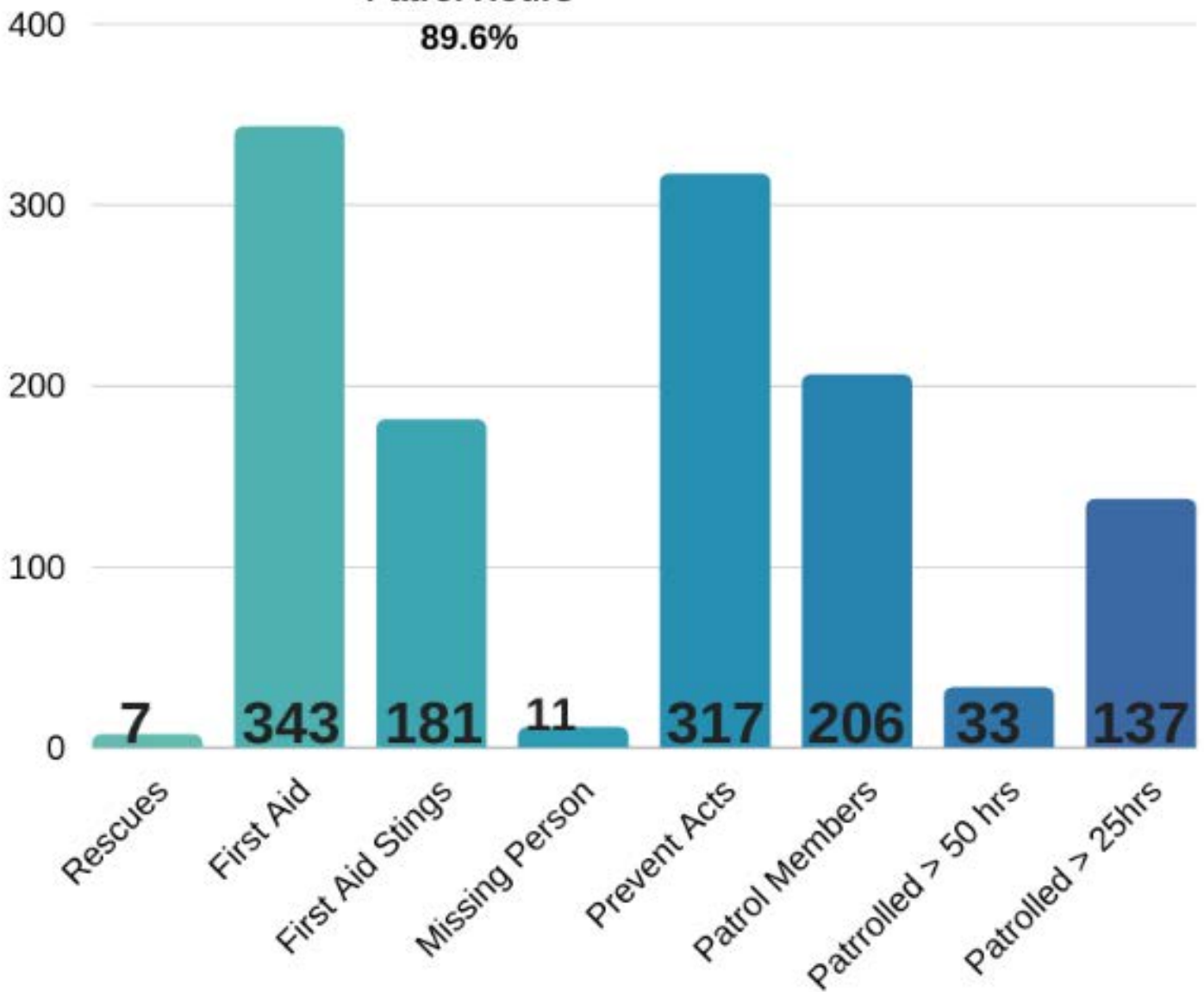

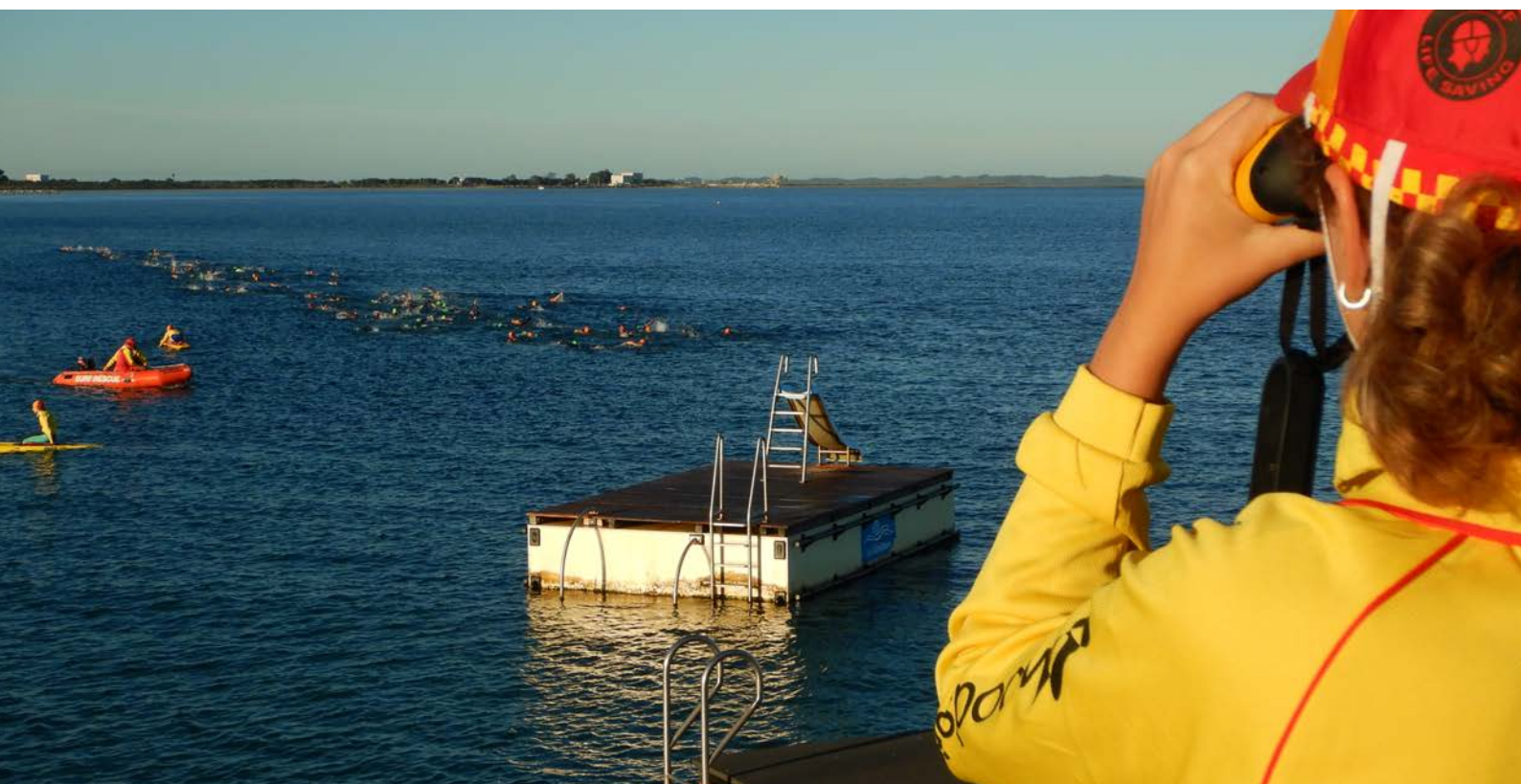
## MEMBER DEVELOPMENT

### Training Team

## SURF SPORTS

The 2020/21 season, saw significant growth in the amount of training available to members. Coogee had a lot of top 10's and finalists, especially in the younger age groups, this depth is a good indicator for future strong results.

The club swim has now become established with over 40 swimmers on some days, a great club achievement and good to see so much activity in the water on a Sunday morning. .





Surf sports have made some significant savings with ALL repairs done in house. Many thanks to Nick Moffatt who repaired in excess of 30 boards! Coogee Beach had a strong showing across all competitions this season, including the newly formed WA Ironman Series & for the first time a representation in the Sunsmart WA Surf League.

### **Sprint/Beach Training**

A big thank you to Zoe Spencer for running another successful season of sprint/beach training. The program has continued to develop from when Zoe took over in 2019. Participation has been strong all season which has directly led to a lot of successful results across the different age groups.

**Boards:** Under the leadership of Ross Davis, and continued support of Ross Kirby, the board training program has seen some of the largest participation ever in board training with numbers regularly in excess of 35. This is in addition to the very strong results across all the different competitions throughout the season.





## Boats

Under the continued guidance of Danny Price, the Boat team has seen a lot of growth this season. They were also responsible for running a very successful ASRL Surfboat Carnival at Coogee Beach on Sunday 8th November 2020. In addition, they were the driving force behind some major fundraisers this season.

## IRB

Coogee Beach for the first time has seen the inception of its very own IRB Racing Team. Through a number of fundraising events, as well as a lot of coordination, they managed to have a strong representation at the 2020 IRB State Championships. The team has already started their training for the 2021 season, and have shown a large increase in its team as well as beginning preparations for the club's first ever hosted IRB carnival.

It features modified Nippers beach and water activities such as games, running, beach flags, wading, swimming and boards as well as activities with the club's Age Group Nippers. The program is run entirely by volunteers at lifesaving clubs around Australia. The program was organised and ran with much success by Simone Blom and her team of volunteers. We are excited to see how this program continues to grow in future years.

Our Surfboat crews ran Cow Pat Lotto this year to fund the purchase of a new Surf Boat.

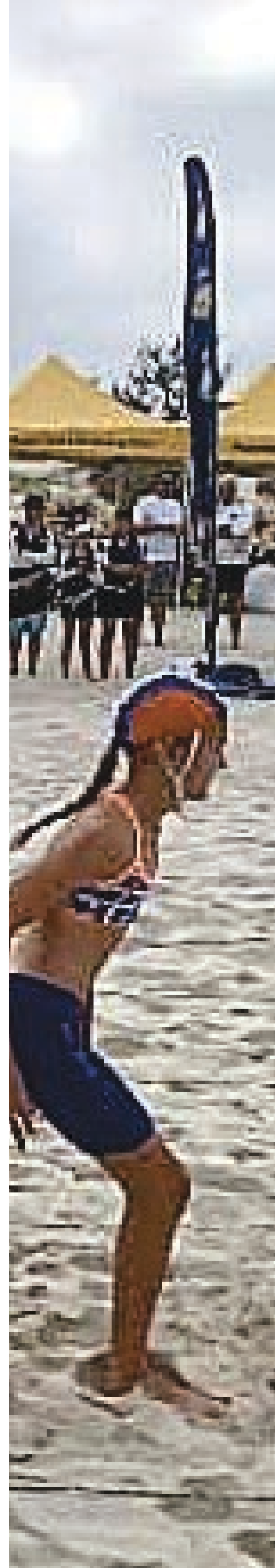
